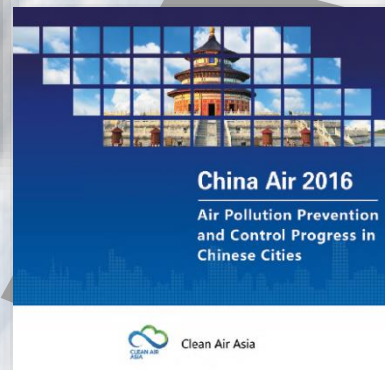

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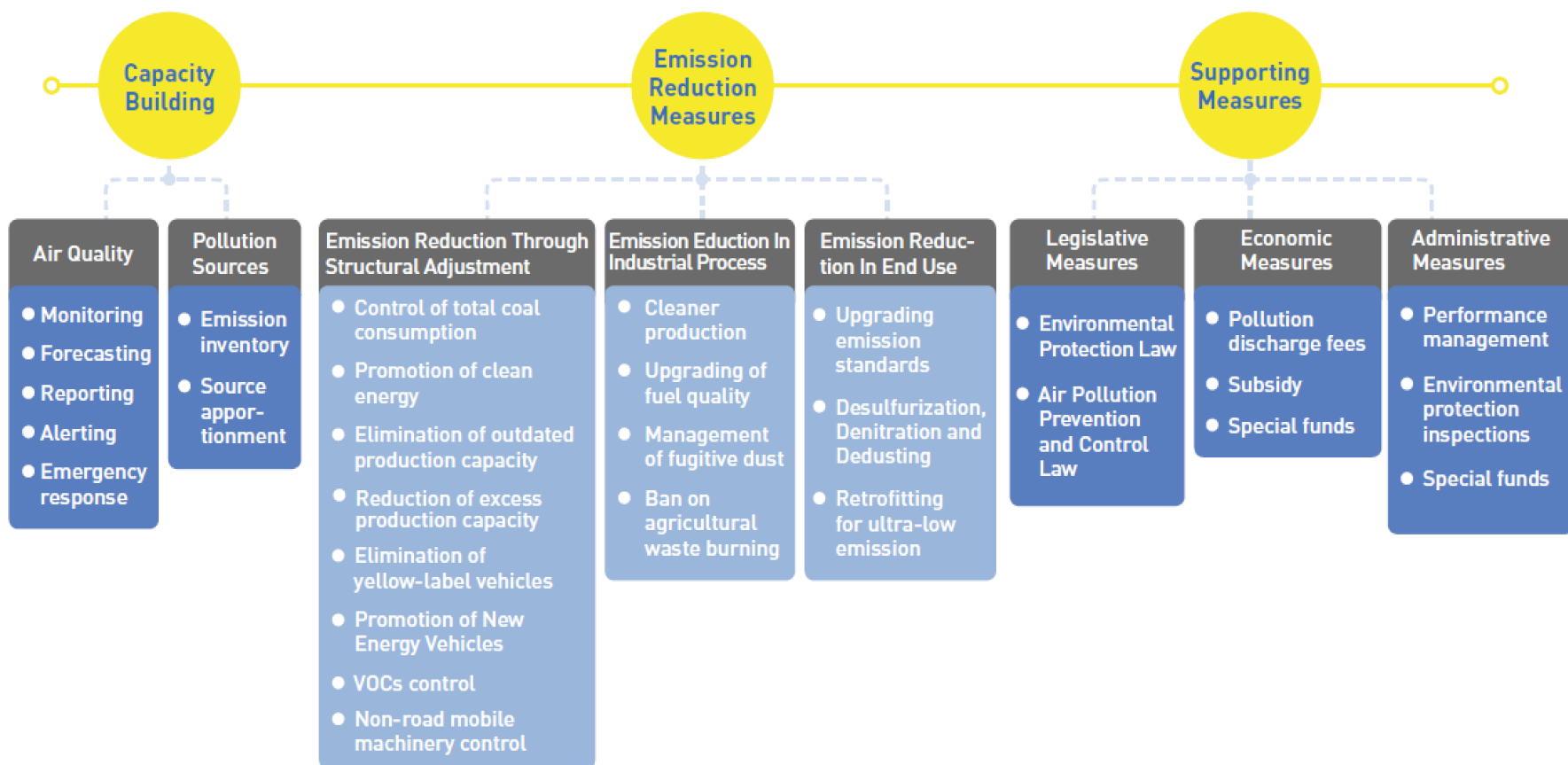

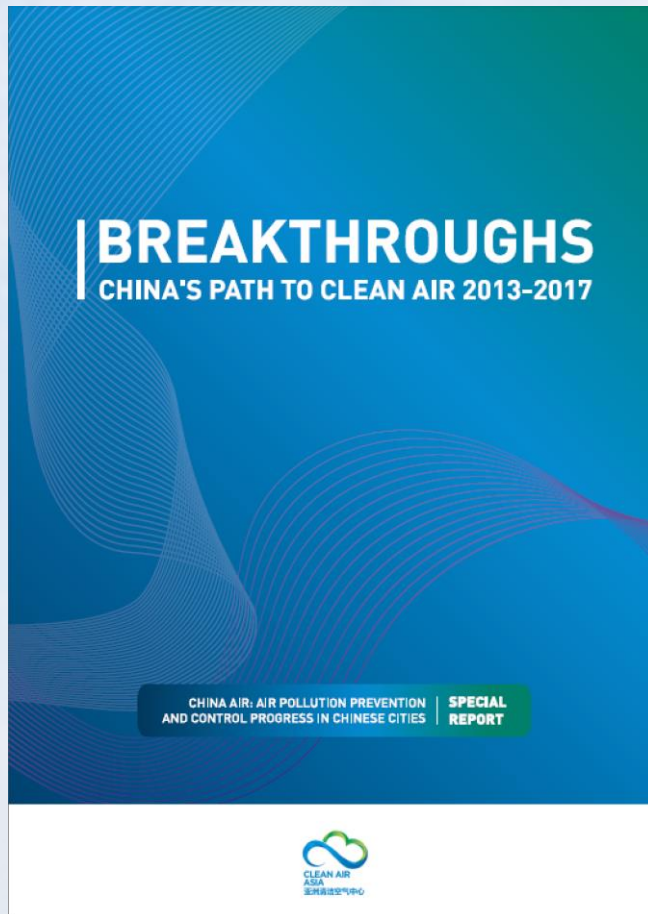

Conclusions

- 1 Top leaders' strong political will to protect human health in response to public demand led to release of national action plan**
- 2 Effective implementation through specific targets and tasks allocation, and clearly defined accountability mechanism**
- 3 Place responsibility on city government for air quality improvement, so all departments concerned work together**
- 4 For key pollution sources' reduction, reduction targets and emission standards were set, enforcement strengthened and economic incentives provided**
- 5 Emphasize on building the foundation for science-based policy formulation and implementation, which is the key for long-term air quality improvement**

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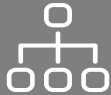
